President's Message:

APRIL 2010

We are pleased to announce newly appointed NYPD Deputy Commissioner of Operations, Patrick Timlin, will be our April Luncheon guest speaker. For 22 years, Commissioner Timlin served the NYPD with the utmost distinction, amassing a broad spectrum of experience along the way. From his service with the elite NYPD Emergency Services Unit, to his overseeing of high profile cases as the head of Detective Borough Queens, Commissioner Timlin embarked upon each of his assignments with both tenacity and innovation. He concluded his career as Commanding Officer of Patrol Borough Bronx, from 2000 to 2002, where he achieved a 16% reduction in felony crime and also implemented several proactive community relations initiatives. After eight years in the private sector, Deputy Commissioner Timlin has returned to the NYPD to oversee the Compstat program; where he will surely reprise his role as an asset to the Department in its ongoing mission to further an already tremendous record of crime reduction.

The Honorable Mayor Cory A. Booker spoke to a standing-room-only crowd at the March luncheon. Members and guests listened with rapt attention as the 36th Mayor of Newark, New Jersey, shared his early grassroots aspirations and the committed values he brings to public office. Mayor Booker paid particular attention to how he tackled the issue of crime that plagued Newark's neighborhoods. It was a critical mission that was first carried out by upgrading police facilities and properly equipping the Newark PD with modern technology. Under Mayor Booker's administration, citywide initiatives have successfully decreased gun violence in Newark by 46% over the last 3 years.

Mayor Booker closed by extending his heartfelt appreciation toward the men and women of law enforcement: "...you are the most important agents in democracy. Strong law enforcement, plus a strong community, can make a way out of no way. It can be done. The threat to our neighborhoods' is the inability to maintain and sustain the values of a community and it is those values we lean upon, as we move toward the future even as we struggle economically. Those who put on a uniform have my extreme gratitude."

It was a dynamic and insightful lecture that drew lengthy applause and a standing ovation at its conclusion. Given his busy schedule, we were truly fortunate to have had Mayor Booker speak at our event and I want to take this opportunity to thank him once more for his incredible generosity.
