### President's Message:

MAY 2010

First, I would like to thank our April Luncheon guest speaker, Deputy Commissioner of Operations Patrick Timlin, for taking the time to address our membership. He was greeted by an enthusiastic capacity crowd eager to probe his extensive experience with the Department and in the private sector. During the lecture, he provided insight into the Compstat Process as an analytical tool to augment the deployment of resources, and delved into the Compstat Theory discussing the basis for its practical use to identify vulnerable neighborhoods on the cusp of a crime spike. He also spoke about the Department's Compstat of the future, and how it will also be used to fight terrorism.

After retiring from the Department in 2002, at the rank of Assistant Chief, Commissioner Timlin joined the Clinton Group, an SEC investment advisor, heading their Anti-Money Laundering and Business Continuity Programs. In 2004, Commissioner Timlin brought his expertise to Michael Stapleton Associates, Ltd., a NY-based security firm that specializes in elevated threat protection and detection services worldwide. Deputy Commissioner Timlin holds a Juris Doctorate from New York Law School and is also a member of the New York State Bar.

Our May Luncheon guest speaker will be the Director, INTERPOL Washington Timothy A. Williams, United States National Central Bureau (USNCB). Mr. Timothy Williams was appointed to this position, a subcomponent of the U.S. Department of Justice, in October 2009. As the Director of INTERPOL Washington, Mr. Williams acts on behalf of the Attorney General as the official representative to the International Criminal Police Organization located in Lyon, France. He also directs all operations, policies and procedures related to INTERPOL Washington.

In October 2006, Mr. Williams began his assignment at INTERPOL Washington as the Deputy Director, and was responsible for overseeing the day-to-day operations and administrative activities of the USNCB. This included managing law-enforcement agents, analysts, and various specialists who operate the Terrorism and Violent Crimes, Drug, Alien Fugitive, Economic Crimes and the State & Local Liaison Divisions, as well as the INTERPOL Operations and Command Center and the Executive Office for the organization. These Divisions facilitate the exchange of information and communications between INTERPOL's 188-member countries with U.S. federal, state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies to enable secure police-to-police communications.
