PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

May 2011

Our May luncheon speaker will be Major General Robert L. Wolf, the Director of Graduate Admissions and Executive Director of Trojan Horse for SUNY Maritime College. Major General Wolf is a graduate of Ithaca College and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps in 1973. After attending the Basic School in 1974, he was assigned duties as a Rifle Platoon Commander and later as a Rifle Company Executive Officer with 3rd Battalion 2nd Marines. Following his FMF tour, he was assigned to Marine Barracks Bermuda, where he was promoted to Captain and served as the Executive Officer. While stationed there, the General was cited for his conduct during the Bermuda riots of 1977 and later for his unit's performance during an emergency evacuation of a commercial airliner. From August 1980 to June 1981, he attended Amphibious Warfare School and received his Master of Business Administration degree from Nova University. Reporting to 3rd Battalion 4th Marines, Camp Schwab, Okinawa, Japan, Major General Wolf served as Commanding Officer of the India Company.

Returning to the United States in June 1982, Major General Wolf reported to the United States Naval Academy as an Instructor of Economics. Upon promotion to Major in 1984, he was designated Executive Assistant to the Director of International and United States Studies, and later as Assistant Branch Head in the Manpower Division.

In June of 1990, Major General Wolf was assigned as Officer-in-Charge, Special Missions Section, Special Operations Training Group. Shortly thereafter, he was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel and assigned as the Assistant Operations Officer for the Commander-in-Chief Atlantic's In-Extremis Force. In December of 1990, he was assigned as Operations Officer to 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit. The General served during *Operations Desert Shield*, *Desert Storm*, *Provide Comfort* and *Provide Promise*. In September 1992, he was the Mission Coordinator for the Tactical Recovery of a G122 Italian aircraft that had been shot down just west of Sarajevo, Bosnia. He was promoted to Brigadier General in July 1999 and to Major General in February 2008, formally assuming command of the New York Naval Militia.

I want to thank our April speaker, Deputy Commissioner, Trials Martin G. Karopkin, Esq. He discussed how the Department accomplishes its mission to give NYPD personnel a fair and expeditious trial consistent with the Department's rules, policies and applicable statutes and law. His insight into the organizational structure of the disciplinary process provided everyone with a firm foundation into how it can translate to other departments and the private sector.

A published writer of numerous law articles, Deputy Commissioner Karopkin is also a former member of the Administrative Review Board of the NYC Department of Health where from 1981-85, he served on a three person panel that functioned as an appellate tribunal reviewing administrative decisions regarding alleged violations of the NYC Health Code. Deputy Commissioner Karopkin earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from the State University of New York at Stony Brook, and a Juris Doctor degree from Brooklyn Law School. He was admitted to the Bar of the State of New York in October 1972.
